Dear DGs, DRFCC and Rotary leaders Dear fellow Rotarians

2011 RRFC Institute Assistant Moderator **Donald Mebus** writes in his April "Coordinator communiqué"-letter:

"Today's world is a place of turmoil and regional struggles. Warring factions of drug cartels are rampant. Riots and armed suppression coupled with war and the displacement of people are causing a huge refugee problem. Earthquakes have taken their toll in Chile, Columbia, Haiti, New Zealand and Japan. Japan is uniquely faced with y hazardous materials. Drought and very large wildfires have been spreading almost unchecked in the U.S., and famine is rampant in the continent of Africa...and the list goes on. Many of us do not even wish to look at news reports anymore knowing that tragedy will most certainly be present. Our friends within our own communities and in other parts of the world are facing unbelievable difficulties".

He still continues: "What Rotary is good at and what is our Foundation's long term goal is to help in the rebirth and rebuilding of an affected area. Our Foundation does this by setting up tools such as the Rotary Japan Disaster Fund or Haiti Earthquake Relief fund which collects funds and distributes them on an as needed basis as countries and towns rebuild. Rotarians did this in Sri Lanka, India, Thailand, Indonesia and other countries around the Indian Ocean following the horrible tsunami of 2004. We certainly have our work cut out for us now as we face the recent disaster in Japan. As we gear up for next Rotary year, we must pay attention and gather information about the needs not only of disaster affected areas but also our own regions. While the level of need in many parts of the world seems overwhelming, Rotarians already have the resources, desire, and drive to keep doing good in the world".

It is simply: "To enable Rotarians to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty.
